Staff used timers to record how long students read for and a record was kept through the week to log how long each individual student read for in school. There were prizes for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place

and also for the team who clocked the highest aggregate minutes of reading.

There were also prizes for fancy dress, entries made for our own short story competition and for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in the national short story competition.

students prefer to attend their lessons on such days due to a variety of reasons. This is always supported by staff and gentle encouragement is offered or activities redirected to their classrooms.
