







## **Tremendous Titanic!**

# **Red Nose Day at the Sessions House**








### Science








## **English**

#### **Votes for Schools**

This half term as part of PSHE, Key stage 3 and 4 pupils have taken part in Votes for Schools sessions. These were already running on the Key Stage 2 Site and pupils have been extremely engaged. During these sessions, pupils debate and discuss a range of topics that are relevant and current; most of which are in the news the previous week. #### Exams

# Life skills and Employability

The students have engaged in a range of activities for their ASDAN Employability course and life skills topics this half term. Following on from career exploration, the students have begun to look at what is involved in the job finding and job application process. This has included a trip to a careers fayre at the Norwich Showground, meetings with our careers adviser and a trip to the local job centre to meet with the Job Centre Plus Employability adviser. This has provided valuable information to the students regarding the current job market and the potential opportunities available to them in the future.

In life skills students have planned and carried out a trip, using public transport, to the local market town of March.

They discovered the various ticket options and how to purchase them and the different ways of obtaining information regarding bus times, such as a visit to the local public transport office, bus station and online. They enjoyed the trip and were lucky to have good weather. They engaged well with transport staff and the public.
