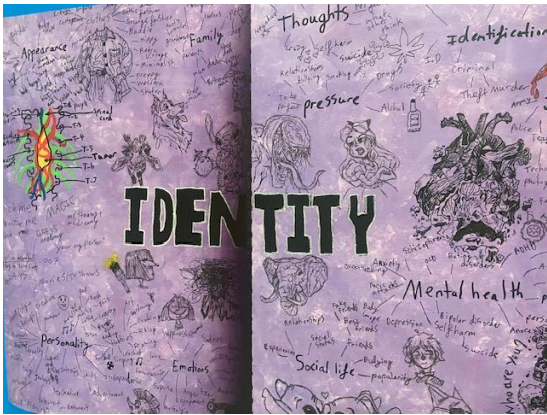

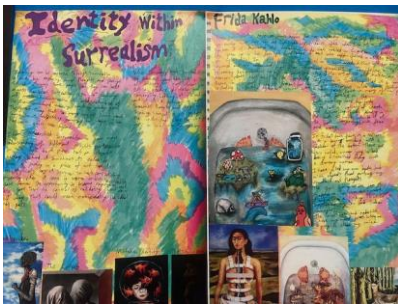
GCSE identity



Year 10 and 11 have been studying GCSE Art, the topic is identity. Students have all gone down their own separate routes to express 'identity'. All students have done mind maps and have all been given the open opportunity to express this in their own unique way. Annotating Art and Artist Research
