Horse Therapy for students at Cambian Scarborough School


This term some of our students have been enjoying trips to Snainton Riding School where they have been taking part in Horse Therapy. Horse Therapy encompasses a range of treatments that involve activities with horses to promote good physical health and mental wellbeing for our students.

The students spend time grooming the horses, tacking them up and leading them to the field or indoor arena where they get to participate in a horse riding lesson.

Our students were a little apprehensive at first, but soon realised that horses can be very calm and gentle and have very good temperaments. We have already seen the benefits of this therapy and have watched our students enjoy their time with the horses and have seen their confidence grow.

Our staff have commented on the very commendable behaviour of our students whilst offsite from school and have loved seeing our students smile and hear them giggle and laugh whilst trotting around on their horses.

The students now look forward to horse therapy each week and thoroughly enjoy this new activity. We hope to extend Horse Therapy in the future to enable more of our students to participate and benefit from this worthwhile addition to the school timetable.





Duke of Edinburgh Expedition

On the 12th of March the pupils set of from Cloughton, just outside of Scarborough, on their walking expedition to Robin Hoods Bay near Whitby. Along the way they were met by the assessors and despite the windy conditions they were full of confidence and really enjoyed the beautiful scenery.

They camped overnight at Robin Hoods Bay and set off the again the following morning, the pupils worked very well together and were happy to have completed the expedition element of the Duke of Edinburgh award.
