Terrific Topic!

During this half term, some of our pupils have been learning about the ‘Great War’ World War 1. In Topic lessons they have used design and technology skills to create Dioramas - models representing a scene with three-dimensional figures – of the World War 1 trenches. Super Sessions House!


This half term at Sessions house, pupils have continued their learning in morning lessons, taking part in English, Maths and Topic. Morning arrival activities have included; listening to stories, quizzes, yoga and hand writing. In English we have looked at character descriptions and using adjectives for effect, as well as reading comprehensions to develop imagery and understanding. In Maths, pupils have used the programme MyMaths to develop knowledge and practice maths skills. In Topic, pupils have completed their dioramas and have now taken them home for people at home to see. It has been wonderful to see the development of skills and creativity involved in making these. In Science pupils have continued learning about solids, liquids and gasses and changes of state. They have looked at designing their own experiments to find out if the changes are reversible or irreversible



Amazing Anglia Way!

During this half term Pupils at Anglia Way have engaged well in English, Maths, Science and Humanities lessons. They have covered a range of topics, some of which included: using a 3D globe to look at continents of the world; created PowerPoints after researching their favourite city; calculating different time zones from around the world and studying the positives and negatives of breeding animals for human use and how this has developed over time.

During the afternoons students have practiced team building skills in outdoor games such as; cricket, football, netball, tennis and basketball. This has really brought the students together and helped build their confidence.
