


The Masked Reader

Sensory Stories



A safe and sensory environment was created in the theatre for World Book Day by the therapy team. Bean bags, chairs, and yoga balls were available for the students to sit on and enjoy the stories being read aloud and acted out by Bridget and Jemma.

The first story entitled 'But don't make a mess' allowed students to bang the door knocker and drop jelly during the lesson. It was a sensory experience with the smell of imperial leather to smell and a soft cloth to wipe the skin while we 'messed up the bathroom'. The water pistol was a big hit, although both Jemma and Bridget ended up with wet bottoms from holding it in their pockets. Other stories include the itchy bear, who can't find a place to scratch his itch and is moved on by various creatures. Students met characters from the story through puppets and various voices.

Our students were supported so well by adults and we were so grateful for their support. We had a great time being creative with the young people and participating in such a fun activity with them in such an inclusive atmosphere.

Heavy Muscle Work







OUTDOOR LEARNING!

March 18th - March 29th Nest Building, Bird Boxes & Tree Planting



Nest Building

Students can resource different materials from the surrounding areas such as horse hair, hay moss and small sticks and design and create their own bird nests. They can then make, draw or cut out a bird of their choice to sit in the nest. They can also add some chocolate eggs if they wish.

Tree Planting

Students will arrive at the yard and be given a choice of trees to plant, they can then go to their designated planting site to plant their trees, adults can assist if and when required.

Bird Boxes

Students can build a bird box using the wooden slats or plastic bottles. They can decorate them as they like, they can then show a member of staff where they would like to put them, it could be in the school grounds, the woods or outside their home/class.



Bark / Leaf Rubbing

Students will arrive at the yard and chose which

paper and coloured wax crayon or chalk they want to use, they will then go for a walk in the grounds

and chose their trees or leaves (or both) they

Tree Identification

Students will arrive at the yard and pick up the tree identification cards, they will then walk around the school grounds with their adult/s to see how many they can find, some of the students may want to write down where they saw them.





Tree Planting

Students will arrive at the yard and be given a choice of trees to plant, they can then go to their designated planting site to plant their trees, adults can assist if and when required.









The Forum Farm

Hi.

We are a very busy team of two at the Forum Farm that consists of myself - Renea, I am the animal lead and a qualified animal assisted therapist and Sam, who is my right hand woman and is the animal therapy assistant. I would like to introduce you to the many ways we work with the students here at the Forum School. We currently have two horses, eight guinea pigs, three rabbits and a bearded dragon and we are based on a 28 acre site.



We have a very busy timetable including student 1-1 sessions, outdoor learning, lunchtime club, after school activities, we also encourage drop in sessions at any time. We have our 'Guinea Pig gang' where students can sit with the guinea pigs. This has two bucket seat chairs, a bookcase and fairy lights. Our 'Warren' has our rabbits. There is a table for students to work at, as well as homemade rabbit games for them to play!









The Forum Farm... Continued

We have four different curriculum-based courses, all of these have 12 stages to complete and each stage is broken down into 10 bite sized achievable sections. When the students complete a stage, they are presented with a booklet and certificate acknowledging their achievements.

Horse Riding – This is for students to experience our horse-riding sessions which helps to improve their core muscle groups, coordination, balance and sense of wellbeing.

Yard Management – This is designed for our students who are not keen on riding the horses but enjoy the yard environment. They learn skills such as feeding, grooming and basic first aid for all of the animals in our care.

Equine Adventures – Some of our students enjoy being around the horses on the ground rather than riding them. This allows students to learn about care of equines and how to interact with them. This is the students first steps into horse care and leads onto Stable Management.

Stable Management – This is similar to Equine Adventures however it focuses more on the horse's health and wellbeing, including tack care, vet responsibilities etc.

Outdoor Learning

We believe that outdoor learning has a valuable impact on our students learning and there has been many studies that place a high importance on its many positive values including social skills, special awareness, ownership of work and overall mental wellbeing. We have designed a yearly planner that ties in with our curriculum, with myself and Sam working closely with the teachers and T.As. It has also enhanced our wider community ties with local businesses donating some of our supplies and creating a wider community spirit.



Drop in sessions

Some of our students from time to time need a place to reflect or relax. They are always encouraged to visit whenever they feel the need to and we have found that some of our students like to just pop in to say hello to either myself and Sam or the animals. It is always nice to see the students on the yard and we understand the importance of them being able to do so.

Lunchtime Club

This is our latest idea for the yard and we wanted to give our students a place to blow of some steam or be creative and make different art/crafts. It is held in the indoor arena every day and is for all students to drop in as they wish.

After School Activities

Our indoor arena is always accessible to our residential students. Mondays are our sensory play activities and Wednesdays are for arts and crafts, however, we are happy for any student to enjoy the facilities at any time.



What another positive month we have had, there is so much to cover which is great. I have picked out some of the highlights! A new young person has arrived this month. This young person has been out of education for a considerable amount of time. Since his first day with us as a resident he has also attended school every day without fail. This is incredible and really shows the support and commitment of all adults across The School.

Firstly I would like to thank each and everyone of you for the support you have had provided to our young people to personally engage in their reviews. There has been a significant improvement in this area this month and this has been noted by parents, social workers and SENCO's. it is so important that our young peoples voices are heard and that they are able to participate in their plans and make choices based on their futures.

To further evidence this we have now reviewed our daily paperwork systems that will support us as adults to evidence the views, wishes and feelings of young people. We have also imbedded Ofsted Quality standards to the daily paperwork to further improve in other areas to show a full over view of positive praise, achievements, activities and sensory diet support. While this is new, the reviews so far have considerably improved recordings of young peoples lived experiences and the support provided by adults that care.

All young people have had their opportunity to complete their say with a survey this month. Young people have mainly reported that they are happy and safe.

There has been some fantastic whole school activities this period with the celebration of Chinese new year, world book day and plans for an end of term disco organised and planned by one of our students L.

There are some exciting plans for the half term holiday with Easter egg hunts and obstacle courses organised. Thank you!
