

Building Bug houses

Students will resource their own materials and

design and create a bug house or hotel. Students will decide which bugs they would like to have in their house or hotel. They can name their house or hotel and collect such materials as moss,











branches, twigs, mud, sand etc.

Making seed feeders


Students will chose their materials to make a bird feeder from, they can chose toilet rolls, pine cones or plastic bottles.
