

Residential Care Services

SEMH & Complex Needs

Our Solo (Single bed), Dual (Two beds) and Group Homes (Three to Six Beds) provide care for young people aged 6 to 18 years old. Our homes are designed to meet the needs and manage the risks of some of the UK's most complex and challenging young people.

We have staffing ratios of 2:1 in our Solo Homes, 1:1 in our Dual Homes and high ratios across our Group Homes. These homes support a pathway for young people who will remain in residential care and where possible return to a family environment. We have a number of SEMH Schools that are able to support the continuity of education.

CSE

Supporting girls aged between 11 & 17 years old who are victims of sexual exploitation. Trauma may be represented in challenging behaviours, attachment disorder, lack of emotional stability, low sense of safety and security, sexual disinhibition and a history of placement breakdown.

Many of the young people that we support will be planned step down placements from a secure service. We have a clear model of care that includes care, therapy and education with an anticipated length of stay of 9 - 12 months.

Our expected outcomes would result in a young person safely returning to a family setting.

Complex Trauma

For children typically aged between suffered trauma as a result of: sexual abuse, neglect, domestic violence, physical harm and bereavement. These children may also show signs of inappropriate/problematic sexual behaviours such as; lack of understanding of appropriate touch, lack of understanding of healthy relationships with adults and peers and lack of understanding of consent. Our service operates a clear model of care, therapy and education with an expected length of stay of 18 to 24 months. Children coming into this service have typically experienced several or multiple previous placement (fostering) breakdowns.

Deaf Services

We have four specialist residential services for the Deaf nationally, supporting deaf, young people and adults from the age of 16. We have strong links to resources for the Deaf nationally and the people we support are encouraged to understand how to use and access services appropriate to them.

The core difference in relation to what we provide is, the fact that our staff are expected to use British sign language at all times whilst at work.

Mental Health Services

Our mental health services offer residential placements to children aged 12-18 who are or have experienced or are experiencing significant mental health needs. Our services are registered with Ofsted with care, clinical and education offerings.

Case Studies

GEORGE'S STORY

George entered Southlands School at 11, diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder and Global Developmental Delay. His struggles with social interactions, self-care, eating habits, and rigid thinking had isolated him prior to enrollment. Initially, his unexpected sensory coping methods disrupted learning and hindered friendship building, while confidence and social skills remained challenges.

At Southlands, George received tailored support, including speech therapy, occupational therapy, and sessions with a clinical psychologist during difficult moments. Augmented visual aids and autism-friendly strategies were implemented, fostering his confidence. As a result, George flourished academically, particularly excelling in subjects like Maths, Science, ICT, and Geography. His newfound confidence empowered him to work independently, socialize more, and eat alongside peers.



With growing self-esteem and reduced reliance on coping mechanisms, George's social interactions improved, contributing to his overall happiness. He achieved significant milestones, such as participating in mainstream college taster days, securing high grades in GCSEs, and pursuing higher education aspirations. George's successful transition to university is a testament to his determination and the support he received at Southlands, leaving both his family and school community immensely proud.

JOSHUA'S STORY

Before Joshua joined Lufton College, his life was marked by severe limitations and frustrations. He faced significant challenges due to his severe learning disabilities, autism, ADHD, and non-verbal communication. Routine changes triggered intense anxiety, leading to potentially dangerous behaviours. As he grew older, his family grew increasingly concerned for their safety, with emergency services even considering mental health unit placement.

At Lufton College, Joshua's transformation has been remarkable. Over the past two years, he has discovered passions for gardening, cooking, art, and technology. Simple tasks that once caused

distress, like bathing and choosing clothes, are now sources of enjoyment. He has embraced outings, made friends, and developed a deeper bond with his family and the Lufton team. Through their exceptional care and understanding, Lufton has provided Joshua with the tools to navigate life's challenges with flexibility and contentment.

Joshua's family expresses immense gratitude for Lufton's unwavering support. Despite initial apprehension about his move away from home, they've found comfort in the warmth and dedication of the Lufton staff. They feel fortunate to be part of the Lufton family and witness Joshua's growth and happiness first hand.
