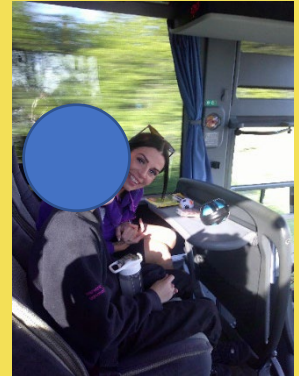


## Horrible Histories Trip
