Staying Safe Over Summer

While children enjoy being out with their friends, there may be times when they do not feel safe or secure and wish to come home. Talking to your child in advance about what to do in these situations can provide peace of mind for both of you. It also helps to model the kind of thinking they will need to do independently as they get older. Things to talk about with your child when safety planning:

- Where are they going and with whom?
- What time should they return and how will they get home?
- Is their mobile phone fully charged?
- Do they have money for a taxi, train or bus fare?
- What should they do if they want to come home early?

Also, when it comes to sun safety, it is good practice to remind children to put sunscreen on before leaving the house, to wear a hat and sunglasses and to stay well hydrated in hot weather by drinking lots of water.

Rievaulx Abbey

In March our history students visited Rievaulx Abbey near Helmsley for the day to complete their entry level site study.



We were fortunate to have brilliant sunny weather while exploring and the students had fun discovering the Abbey ruins. They looked at the impact the Abbey had on the local area and the importance of the Abbey itself.

Online Safety & Apps – Keeping Your Child Safe

ZEPETO is a new social media app with an age rating of over 13. Users create their own avatars and can design rooms. ZEPETO is a social networking app and therefore users can chat with others. Due to the communication option there are the usual risks, such as your child seeing inappropriate content or online bullying.
