School theme for this | Purple Class - Sammy half-term is Space

Each half-term the school will have a whole school theme that we will thread into every aspect of our learning.

This term the whole school theme is Space.

Each class will be learning about space and using the theme in every area of learning for the young people. You will see throughout the class halftermly synopsis that each class is incorporating the theme in a way that the learners can engage.



Autumn 2 Term's theme is Chocolate

This year Sammy is leading Purple Class as the class teacher. Purple class is supported by Niamh as the teaching assistant together this duo will work hard together to ensure the children and young people are reaching their full potential in all areas of their learning.


This term in Purple Class we have been looking at the topic 'Space'. In Literacy and Communication, we have been exploring the story 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy. Our student have enjoyed listening to the story and exploring sensory stimuli around the story.

Additionally, we have also been developing our independence and life skills by learning to make a drink independently and identify coins from a variety of different objects.

Purple class have been attending weekly horse-riding lessons where we are developing skills such as confidence, resilience and independence.

In Maths, we have been focusing on recognising and counting numbers up to 5, using music and puppets.

One of main targets this term is developing communication. We have been busy embedding our new key words through our regular communication methods and introduced vocab sessions as well as continual practice throughout the school day. The understanding and application of our new key words are further developed through the use of visuals, talking buttons and our AAC devices.





Lilac Class - Shifa

Shifa is the teacher of our new class, Lilac. Shifa has said that "in Lilac class, every child is encouraged to learn, grow, and shine in their own unique way."

In Autumn 1, our theme is Space. In Literacy and Communication, we have worked on expanding a range of prepositions in a wide range of contexts. In Maths, we have been focusing on number and recognising and copying simple patterns and sequences.

Within our Sports and Leisure topic we have been focusing on step aerobics as well as, rolling, throwing and catching balls.



During Community Access lessons we have been talking about social awareness and relationships and making it meaningful by linking this to everyday life and specific situations.

Independence and Life Skills are being developed this half-term by learning about the use of money and how to use it wisely.

Finally, we have been exploring sensory stories linked to the countryside responding to colour, texture, and materials.

We have a trip to go pumpkin picking soon – date TBC!

Green Class - Yvonne

Yvonne continues to be the class teacher in Green class this year, supported by Madeeha, teaching assistant.

In Green class our topic, like the rest of the school is Space which is intertwined through other areas of the curriculum. We have been role-playing with a rockets and astronauts including regular roleplay visits to different planets in our solar system. In Literacy and Communication, the story we are learning about is "The Dinosaur that pooped a rocket".

In Maths, we are learning numbers 1 – 5 using real life situations which have been developed around the classroom. Within our role-play area we are identifying coins when we are shopping.

During our Creative lessons we have been exploring seasonal art, identifying Autumn leaves and animals typically associated with the season such as hedgehogs and foxes.

Within Forest School we have been taking part in sensory walks to locate common woodland bugs that may be hiding within out school grounds, different types of trees and observing the seasonal changes by looking at the colour.

With her experience within specialist education Ellen will really be able to get stuck in with this new group of learners and developing her teaching space to suit the needs for all young people. Ellen has said "I am looking forward to see the progress the pupils make this year as they have made such a positive start." Keep up the good work Ribble.

In Ribble class this year we are developing our independence skills and understanding our community. All the pupils have made a fantastic start to the term and have been working hard in all their subjects.

Within PE lessons we have a dance teacher coming on a Thursday to teach street dance and acrobatic dance. The boys have all really enjoyed these sessions and have developed in confidence.

During computing lessons, we have been learning about the parts of a computer and different storage devices. We have also been developing our understanding of input and output devices.

In learning for life, we are developing our understanding of different jobs that we could have when we are older. We have explored the different qualities and skills that we need for those jobs. A local PCSO is coming in to talk about the different roles within the Police and how we can achieve a career within the Police force.

We are following the whole school theme of Space and this is delivered via a thematic curricular. Our class story is "Man on the Moon", we are suing this story to scaffold our Space themed short stories.
