WORK EXPERIENCE

- Six of our students have taken part in work-related learning at the New Forest Fruits Farm. They have been involved in weeding, planting, harvesting, and maintaining the large number of polytunnels. This farm supplies strawberries to national supermarkets.
- Two of our students have been volunteering at the New Forest for Ukraine charity. They have prepared donation packages by arranging, sorting, and boxing up essential supplies to be sent to Ukraine.
- Three of our students have undertaken work-related learning at the Red Lion, our village's local public house. On Friday mornings, they have cleaned and prepared the dining tables, sorted cutlery, and set out napkins ready for the lunchtime sitting.
- Two of our students have been volunteering at the Milford on Sea Community Centre every Monday. They have completed a wide variety of jobs to an excellent standard, including cleaning equipment, sorting cutlery and clothing for the charity shop, creating resources for events, and moving stock to the shop.

PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENTS

- Twenty eight of our students have been working hard towards reaching their IEP targets and curriculum goals.
- Twenty-two of our students have been enjoying and achieving at the Tile Barn Activity Centre, where they have taken part in a variety of activities designed to build confidence, teamwork, and new skills.
- Eighteen of our students have taken part in PEDALL, a programme that provides therapeutic cycling sessions to support wellbeing, independence, and personal development.
