Beats Bus!

Two imaginative students teamed up with Beats Bus, a mobile recording studio based in Hull, to write and produce their very own song — a creative partnership that shows just how powerful music education can be. Beats Bus's mission is more than simply making music, it aims to use song writing to teach critical thinking, media literacy, confidence and expression.

Over a series of workshops, the Beats Bus tutors took our students through the whole process; developing ideas, working on lyrics, exploring beats and arranging the track. The students contributed their own themes and helped select the instrumentation with guidance on structure, melody, rhythm and production.

The final product is a song that reflects both pupils' experiences; friendship, hopes and a sense of trying something new outside of their comfort zones. While the style leans on modern beats with some hip-hop influences (a genre central to Beats Bus's teaching ethos), the mood also incorporates personal stories from the pupils' lives.

For many involved, the biggest change has been not just what has been created, but what has been gained. Boosted confidence, improved communication, the experience of working as a small creative team — these are all outcomes that teachers and Beats Bus organisers cite as evidence of the project's value.
