Letter for SLT

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we start 2026 we have been having a real focus on the learning journeys of staff and children. We are extremely proud of the mature and focused manner in which our students have approached their GCSE mock examinations. Their commitment, resilience, and determination have been evident throughout, and they should be commended for the effort they have invested in doing their very best. The mock examinations will continue next week for some students, while others will be undertaking a week of work experience within the local community. Both pathways provide valuable opportunities for personal growth, and we are confident that our students will represent the school with responsibility and enthusiasm.

The week has been marked by wet and windy weather, which has made some of our usual outdoor activities more challenging than usual. Nevertheless, students have remained engaged and active, making excellent use of the gym to refine their curling skills and attending sessions at the local swimming pool to maintain their physical exercise.

Meanwhile, the Student Council met on Monday to discuss the ideas and suggestions put forward by tutor groups. They have already generated some thoughtful proposals for an Easter-themed day, along with a number of promising fundraising initiatives.

As we have informed you all, last week we had our annual Care Ofsted inspection, the visit went well and we were excited to show off the progress our staff and children have made over the last year.

All of our children are flourishing with success with their hobbies and interests which include; running, karate, gym sessions, football matches, K-pop dancing, script writing, Lego building and finally attending the Southlands discos with all of their friends. Our discos give an opportunity for our children to grow their friendships, relationships and for some their dance moves! We are not sure who enjoys the discos more, the staff or the children.

We are also very proud of the development our staff have made over the last year; some of our managers have passed their Level 5 Diploma in Leadership and Management for Residential Childcare, which is a key UK qualification for managers and deputy managers in children's homes. Lots of our staff have progressed through their Level 3 Diploma for Residential Childcare. It requires learners to be working in a residential setting to demonstrate competence in safeguarding, positive behaviour management, and supporting children with complex needs.

We are working hard on the plans for the children in 2026 which already include more discos, our second charity colour run and as many trips and visits as we can to inspire our children to progress in their hobbies and interests.

For some of our children we have our annual holiday booked for March, which this year is in Wales, this is to allow for one of our children to go on a shopping spree in Cardiff and another to achieve his life goals of visiting as many 'Dr Who' land marks as they can in four days.

We also have a goal for this year which is to have all of our Care Team qualified in the Level 3 Diploma for Residential Childcare; we will support and guide them through this over the coming year.

Setthorns


This week there were a lot of exciting activities in Setthorns.

Some of the students enjoyed a trip to St Mary's Stadium to watch a football match.




DT also went on an exciting trip to Laser Tag in Southampton




