


CONGRATULATIONS to NB on earning his Blue Belt in Karate this week. He has not missed one training session and has shown true dedication to learning and working towards this.

Primary Nurture





Forest School

Last week, due to high winds, one of our Forest School sessions took place indoors. MK and JD began their play cautiously, gradually becoming immersed in the world of Jurassic Park. Following their own ideas, they selected materials and created an environment for their dinosaurs, building shelters, pathways, and safe spaces where the animals could feel comfortable.



As the play developed, the children expanded their enclosures, connected different areas, and added a variety of habitats. Later, their storyline evolved further, inspired by Jurassic World, with dinosaurs attempting to escape and police cars, helicopters, and the military involved in chasing them.

This led to thoughtful discussion about the dinosaurs' behaviour. JD shared that the animals were unhappy because they were kept in enclosures and could not roam freely. Together, the children explored what might help the dinosaurs feel happier and agreed that a more suitable habitat, including mountains for climbing, would better meet their needs.



This session was a strong example of child-led play, creativity, and rich scenario development. It supported empathy, social interaction, communication skills, and fine motor development.

The children were so deeply engaged in their play that they completely lost track of time.


