

The young people at Pengwern have been helping their local wildlife by taking part in the RSPB's Big Schools' Birdwatch.

Over the last two decades, more than 70 different species have been recorded in school and college grounds, giving the RSPB an astonishing amount of insight into how our wildlife is faring.

The Birdwatch involved the learners making fat balls and putting out mixed seed for the birds then watching from the classroom and counting the birds that visit the college grounds and outdoor spaces, before submitting their results to the RSPB. The Birdwatch – which takes place during the first half of the Spring term (6 January – 13 February) – is a chance for our learners to participate in a UK-wide citizen science project.

As usual the students thoroughly enjoyed watching and counting the birds that visited our bird feeding station.
