World Book Day

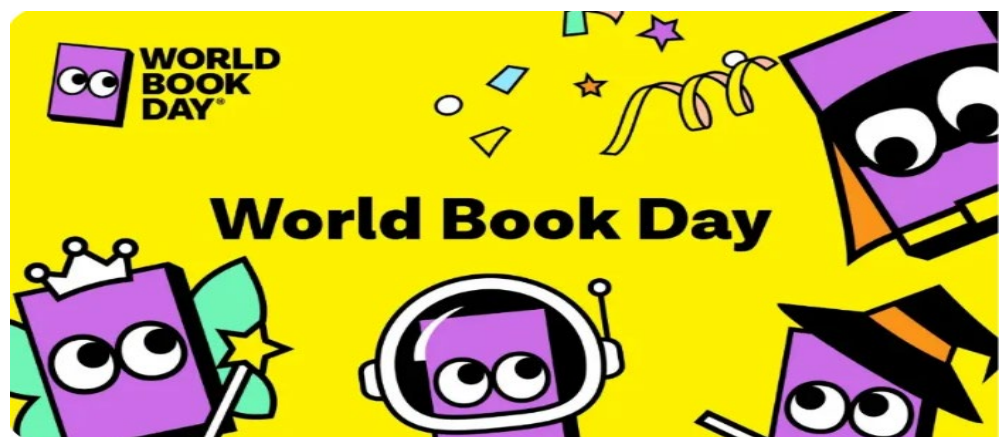
On Thursday 5th March our staff and students celebrated World Book Day and the joy of reading!
