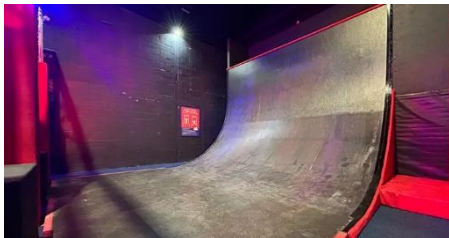


Cambian Hereford School Celebrates Student Success with Rewarding Ninja Warrior Trip
