Marvellous Mechanics

Talk like a pirate day!



This half term in Maths, pupils have studied and produced some excellent work on transformations and percentages. During the transformations topic they have learnt about rotation, reflection, translation and enlargement. Pupils have then enjoyed using the computer programme My Maths to assess and consolidate their learning. In the percentages topic they have learnt to find a percentage of an amount both with and without a calculator. They have also been able to increase or decrease by a certain percentage – a skill that will come in handy when sale shopping in the future!









Excellent English

In English this half term students have been engaging well in the topic of 'Villains'. This has focused on the American mobster; AL CAPONE. Students have learnt a lot about him, used sources to infer what kind of person he was and have used this information to write newspaper articles about him on the St Valentine's Day Massacre.

Students have started practice papers for their upcoming Functional Skills Level 1 exams. All students have tried really hard with these and it is clear how much effort they have put in to do well.

Students have also been completing work on the alphabet, spellings and how to write a newspaper article.









Hair and Beauty

This half term in hair and beauty we started by looking at how to offer a professional service and what you would do and ask a client initially before using products of them. Students designed client cards and then began

following nail care processes and professional manicures, they then moved on to pedicures and beauty treatments such as; foot, hand and arm massages, hand and foot masks and foot spas. After covering this topic for 3 weeks we then moved on to facials, treatments and looking at different products for different skin types. We set up the beauty bed and put together homemade face masks and tried them out. Students designed their own poster with tips to help different skin types. Students went out and collected brochures and looked around a professional hair and beauty services shop, students then started looking at hair types, different hair styles and how to create different looks. Next half term the students will be focusing on hair, eyelashes and makeup and will be taking a trip to the local college to the hair and beauty salon.





Magical Mermaids!

On Monday 10th September, Mermaid Twinkle came into school to teach our children all about recycling and why it is important to look after our environment. The children had a wonderful time and really enjoyed meeting a real life mermaid! She told us all about the competition she is part of and we even got to help her to make part of her outfit. Life Skills and Employability

Building on their existing knowledge of public transport, students researched and planned a bus journey. They found out where to obtain information about timetables, destinations and ticket prices as well as the locations of bus stations and appropriate stops. A successful journey was completed to March, where the students were able to experience a new town and practice their social skills. Following the sessions, 2 students put their new skills into practice by completing bus journeys independently in their free time – a great example of out-of-school learning!

Students learned about the importance of budgeting their money, the differences between needs and wants and put their skills into practice when shopping for school groceries. This led to the settling of an argument that Heinz beans were the best when a blind baked bean taste test was conducted. Humanities

This half term we have been focusing on 'Crime and Punishment'. This has linked well with the Villains topic in English.
