So far, they have analysed characters and thought about writing setting descriptions. In maths they have covered work on negative numbers and problem solving with decimals. In science the class have looked at the three states of matter before moving onto their topic about sound. The class have also planned routes using their knowledge of map-reading. Over in the Koalas class this week they have started a new topic of 'Exploring Environments'. This began by visiting Sandringham Woods and Old Hunstanton beach where they looked at rocks and soils. The children collected samples of these to bring back to school to investigate. They also collected other beach and woodland items to create a 'sea scape' and 'woodland scape' art piece. In Maths they have started learning about measurement and in English have used their trip to the beach to inspire some sentence writing about the cliffs. In the kitchen this week the young people have been making homemade honeycomb biscuits, these were very nice and the young people very generously let staff have a taste. In Art and Humanities' this week, they have been finishing off painting their canopic Jars. Each one is looking very realistic and soon they will be able to take them home and show them off.
