# **Thrive**







Hi I'm Emma, I have been working at New Elizabethan supporting our students for the past five years and I am delighted to have now completed my training to become our licenced THRIVE practitioner in lower school.

As a school we know that our students learn best when they are happy and settled so to support this we are introducing an initiative called the Thrive Approach to help us develop our pupils' emotional and social well-being. THRIVE has been introduced into lower school throughout autumn term and will be introduced into upper school throughout the spring

Thrive helps us to check our young people's readiness to learn, to identify any gaps and then plan to meet them. Through doing so, we are able to make sure that all of our pupils have what they need to make the best possible progress in their learning.

Our Thrive curriculum is for all students which they will have access to through weekly class sessions, small groups and one to one sessions where it is needed.

To support THRIVE within school we have opened a THRIVE room which is a calm nurturing space where our students can come for their 1-1sessions, or to spend some quiet time when they need it. The students love their new room and we are already seeing the Positive Impact of introducing THRIVE into school, I look forward to sharing more information with you as we continue with our THRIVE journey at New Elizabethan.



## Social Café

September 2021 has welcomed a new cohort of students into Sixth Form.

Last year the sixth formers worked exceptionally hard to set up, and market a brand-new café which ran weekly throughout the Summer term. However, this year we have had 4 new students join the café, and they have brought just as much enthusiasm, and ideas with them.




when you get a chance.
