Dear Parents and Carers

We are delighted to report that we've had a lovely gentle start to 2022. We had purposefully designed a quiet month in anticipation of disruption. We were quite nervous about the impact of Covid in the new year, as January 2021 had been really challenging. However, with increased safety measures, vaccinations and regular testing, cases have been very low throughout the school, with no impact on our classes.

Endeavour class have started a new work experience venture thanks to the enthusiasm and commitment of one of our parents who has welcomed the class to his Golf centre. It is wonderful to offer a new experience for our students, we are keen to enrich the lives of all.

One of our areas of development is to promote the wellbeing of our young people. Steve, has been promoted to our Sports Lead and our students now have additional PE lessons as well as weekly swimming lessons (although not for the next fortnight as the pool is refurbished) We are also focusing on children's mental health during the national awareness week starting February 7th 2002. A working group of our teachers and

therapists have developed a variety of events themed on the 5 ways to wellbeing which we wish to incorporate as an integral part of school life.
