Next, we decided to go on the Buffalo Stampede Ride and were caught in the rain. This ensured that we continued to be rather damp.


We all and enjoyed the Bumper Boats and, surprisingly, we all managed to stay quite dry.


Firstly, we went on the Log flume and, once again, found ourselves fairly soaked. Being a sunny, warm day, we soon dried off whilst we had some lunch.


The most popular ride was the dinosaur roller coaster – a fairly short track but one that flung everyone around so forcefully that it became obvious why we needed to be strapped in so securely.

Wickstead, it was decided, was even better than Twin Lakes had been the previous day.











#### Description of trip:




#### Description of trip:




### Description of trip:

Everyone enjoyed the bowling and celebrated different levels of skill - and techniques - in the game.


The children sat by the sea wall and ate their lunch, then it was into the arcade for some time spending money on the slot machines. Even though nobody won, everyone had fun!


Lastly (but not least!) we all had an ice cream or a slush, sat on the wall by the green, enjoying the sunshine.










