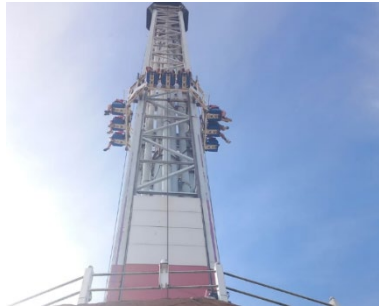

The learners had so much fun on the lake at Wake,

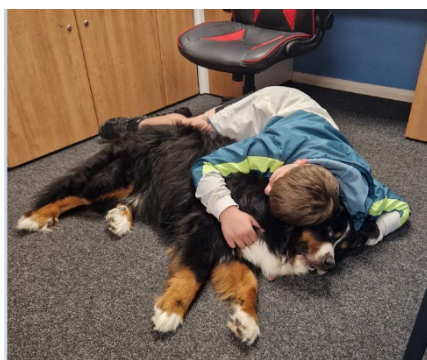
Some learners hesitant to get in and others eager to run the race.
