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WORK EXPERIENCE

PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENTS

- AS, a member of the School Council, received Sixth Form certificates in Maths, Science, Food Technology, and Geography during the Summer Celebrations, along with the Sixth Form Trophy for overall Educational Achievement; he also took part in the Grateley Stomp and helped run the school tuck shop.
- Outside of college, CH took part in all in-school sporting activities, including the Grateley Stomp, the Fun Run (winning every distance raced), and two offsite trips to Wales, one involving climbing Snowdon and gorge scrambling, and the other climbing Pen y Fan. In the Summer Celebrations, CH received both the Personal Achievement Trophy and the Sports Person Trophy.
- FS continued his A levels studies at Andover College, achieving two B grades. His success was recognised in the Summer Celebrations with the Sixth Form Art Certificate and the Trophy for Success at College Award.

- After his amazing contribution to the restoration work carried out on the Watercress Line, LB was awarded the Work Experience Shield in our Summer Celebrations.
- Having settled well into working in Andover College, RT was awarded a Sixth Form Art Certificate.
- CMA was a stalwart in one of our residential houses, regularly undertaking fitness runs with a staff member, visiting the local Warhammer shop, or spending his leisure time developing his painting and drawing skills. While on site with staff support, he revised for his GCSE exams, earning Upper School Certificates in Science, Art, and History, as well as trophies for Art, the Davies Cup for progress in KS4, and the Cambian Award. CMA was also a member of the School Council and participated in numerous Grateley sporting activities, including the Swimathon, the Grateley Stomp, the three-day Snowdon trip, and the residential trip to South Cerney Water Park.

- After nearly six years at Grateley, CMA will be moving on to continue his sixth form studies.
- JT will commence his studies at Andover College.
- MA and HL will move into Grateley House School's Sixth Form to continue their studies.
