



EACH YEAR, AN AWARD CEREMONY IS HELD TO CELEBRATE AND RECOGNISE ALL OF THE EXTRAORDINARY WORK THAT GOES ON ACROSS THE COMPANY AND THE VARIOUS SITES, SCHOOLS AND HOMES.
