





English

In Year 7, we have been continuing our learning based on 'Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo'. We have been exploring the relationship between the main characters, the factors that lead to their conflict, and how that conflict is resolved. Next, we will be writing non-chronological reports on orangutans, which are featured in the novel.

This half term, we have been reading 'Refugee Boy' by Benjamin Zephaniah. Year 8 have really impressed staff with their maturity and enthusiasm when discussing some of the themes of the book (including war, persecution, immigration, asylum seekers and racism). We have been practising selecting evidence (quotations) from the text and writing short analytical paragraphs -using the P.E.E.L. structure.





In Year 9, we are exploring 'Portal Stories'. These are stories where the main characters travel from a 'normal' location to a new magical or fantastical world through a portal or doorway. Students have read and explored how 'portals' have been used in famous portal stories such as 'Alice in Wonderland', 'The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe' and 'The Wizard of Oz' – as well as lesser-known examples from fiction, poetry and film. Following on from last half term's topic (Gothic Literature), students have also been consolidating and extending their understanding of techniques writers use to build a story



Nurture

This half-term we have continued our journey in Nurture. We have worked hard to improve our skills in Maths and English and as an addition to the English lessons, we have introduced "My love for reading"-lessons.

During these lessons, we have read Harry Potter together and afterwards discussed the scenery and characters.

We have also moved classroom. The students took part in sorting our things and packing everything we wanted to bring to the new classroom. We have now settled and are happy with our new "home".

Billy and Ms Palmer have been talking about and researching the history of Milton Keynes' famous 'concrete cows'


We went to visit them in their home at Bancroft Park and read up on some more of their history whilst there.
