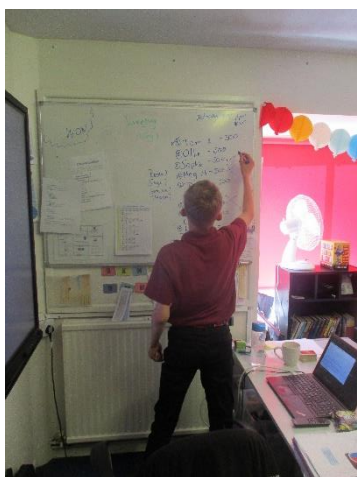


House Point Competition - UNO Championship
