- To enjoy exploring the picturesque gardens at Sandringham House.



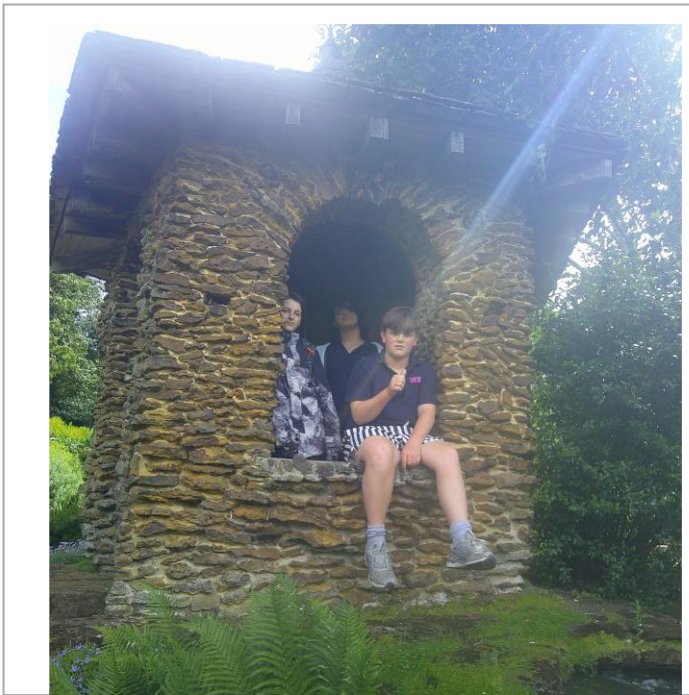
